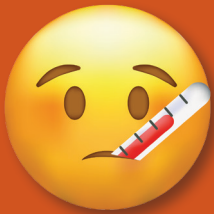


When Should I Stay Home?

I HAVE A COUGH

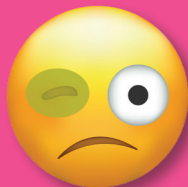
