Conference Objectives

- Describe the effects of childhood trauma on developing children, recognize different symptoms of PTSD and comorbid conditions, and list evidence-based treatments and resources.
- Improve understanding of the prevalence of depression in adolescents and racial and ethnic considerations, review evidence-based screening and assessments tools and review the risks and benefits of treatment options.
- Summarize diagnostic criteria for common anxiety disorders and obsessive-compulsive disorder to differentiate between the disorders and describe first- and second-line treatment strategies for anxiety and obsessive-compulsive disorder.
- Identify the developmental, psychiatric and social sequelae that are occurring as a result of substance use in adolescents and recognize evolving trends.

- Recognize the biological mechanisms underlying aggression, and determine differential diagnoses of these symptoms, as well as review evidence-based treatments and resources.
- 6. Recognize how to differentiate ADHD from psychiatric conditions that might resemble this condition, and learn about common ADHD medications along with their mechanisms of action and ongoing management, as well as non-pharmacological interventions.
- Identify the diversity, scope and breadth of behavioral programs offered at Akron Children's Hospital across the service line, primary care practices and subspecialty clinics and how to access innovative, evidence-based care delivery for patients.
